






2018-2019 Income






2018-2019 Expenses

Goals:

- 1) Identify characteristics of US health systems that are associated with active reporting of these data to NHSN
- 2) Determine how these data from NHSN are being used by health systems and,
- 3) Identify barriers to participating in reporting these data to NHSN. The data gathered in this survey will be used to generate a report that will be published in a peer reviewed journal and shared with relevant stakeholders at the CDC.







Advocacy

The SIDP Political Advocacy Committee advocates to various government and private entities on matters related to antimicrobial use and resistance.[4]

In January 2019, SIDP's President, Kerry LaPlante, attended the public meeting of the Presidential Advisory Council on Combating Antibiotic-Resistant Bacteria (PACCARB.) The purpose of this meeting was to respond to the charge of the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services to gather public input on combating antimicrobial resistance. [5] In her public comments, LaPlante asked that the Council prioritize accelerating research and development of new antimicrobials through innovative funding mechanisms, protecting the supply of existing drugs, and a new priority to develop strategies to mitigate antiinfective shortages. Pharmacist representation on the Council was also requested. [6]


