Post-Graduate Year Two Infectious Diseases Residency Program

The PGY2 Infectious Diseases Residency Program began in July 2014. The program was accredited by ASHP in September 2015. The emphasis of this program is to develop pharmacists adept in clinical management of infectious diseases and antimicrobial stewardship. The graduates of our PGY2 program will be prepared to practice as clinical specialists in infectious diseases, manage antimicrobial stewardship programs, and educate residents and students in infectious diseases pharmacotherapy.

- Restricted Antimicrobial Approval

*Antimicrobial stewardship service component is every third weekend (2x8 hour shifts). We comply with the ASHP resident work hour regulations.
